CHAPTER 17. "Of the Perseverance of the Saints"

Once saved, always saved (An evil distortion of the doctrine of perseverance)

Arminian Baptists are inconsistent.

Perseverance versus Apostasy

- I. Paragraph 1: Apostasy is impossible for true believers
 - A. It is impossible for true believers to totally or finally fall away.
 - B. True believers may fall away for a time due to any number of reasons, but will repent and turn back to God.
- II. Paragraph 2: Perseverance is God's doing
 - A. As with other saving graces, the basis of perseverance is election.
 - B. It is a link in a chain of evangelical graces:
 - 1. election, redemption, regeneration, calling, adoption, sanctification, assurance
- III. Paragraph 3: Stumbling saints are renewed
 - A. Remaining sin, temptations of Satan, and the world cause us to fall and grieve the Spirit.
 - 1. Grieving the Spirit can result in temporal judgments (i.e., in the present, not at judgment day)
 - B. By repentance, the saints are renewed
