CHAPTER 29. "Of Baptism"

An individual ordinance Baptismal regeneration Infant baptism (paedobaptism) Believer baptism Sacrementalism

- I. Paragraph 1: Baptism is commandment of Christ
 - A. Baptism is ordained by Christ as a sign that the believer has entered into life.
 - B. Baptism is symbolic for death and resurrection, purification by the remission of sins, and a new life in Christ.
- II. Paragraph 2: Baptism is for believers only
 - A. Only believers should be baptized.
 - B. Believers are those who repent of their sin, profess faith in and are obedient to Christ.
- III. Paragraphs 3: Baptism by water and the Word
 - A. Water is the prescribed element for baptism.
 - B. Baptism should be in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- IV. Paragraph 4: Baptism should be by immersion.
 - A. Immersion in water is necessary for proper administration of the ordinance.
