The Eternal State: Glorification

- I. Paragraph 1: Judgment day
 - A. Christ is the righteous judge.
 - B. Apostate angels and all persons that have lived will be judged.
 - C. All will be called to give an account for their thoughts, words and deeds.
- II. Paragraph 2: The necessity of judgment: God's glory
 - A. Mercy for the elect
 - B. Damnation for the wicked
 - 1. Eternal torment and punishment
 - 2. Denied the presence of God and His glory
- III. Paragraph 3: The value of judgment
 - A. As a deterrent to sin for all mankind.
 - B. As a consolation to the saints militant: they shall have justice. All wrongs will be righted.
 - C. The Day of Judgment has been kept secret to suppress reliance on this world and promote preparedness for the next.

Several things should be noted about this last chapter.

- 1. Heaven is not mentioned
- 2. None of the Scripture footnotes pertaining to the judgment are from Revelation.
- 3. Little is said regarding the final condition or location of the saints.
