CHAPTER 9. "Of Free Will"

- I. Paragraph 1: Free will defined
 - A. God created mankind with the ability to choose spiritual good or evil.
 - B. God does not force us to choose against our will.
- II. Paragraph 2: The first estate: an innocent nature (pre-fall)
 - A. Before the fall, mankind had true free will.
- III. Paragraph 3: The second estate: a sin nature (post-fall)
 - A. After the fall, we have the freedom to choose spiritual good, but not the ability to do so.
 - B. Original sin, by imputation, has placed our will in bondage to sin.
 - C. If God left us to ourselves, we cannot choose to believe the gospel.
- IV. Paragraph 4: The third estate: a redeemed nature (believers)
 - A. Our ability to choose spiritual good is reborn by the operation of the Holy Spirit.
 - B. Remaining sin prevents us from always doing spiritual good (see Romans 7).
- V. Paragraph 5: The fourth estate: a glorified, perfect nature
 - A. In the intermediate and eternal states, believers will be free from sin and not able to fall.
